STATUS OF 2001-02 AND 2002-03 APPLICANTS AND PROGRAMS**

**2001-2002**

**Wisconsin Higher Education Grant - UW**

WHEG - UW has committed 134.77% (\$26,617,988) of its appropriation with 23,049 awards. This is 447 more awards and 0.18% less committed than at this time last year. In 2000-01 the program had committed 134.95% of its appropriation at this time. The final commitment for 2000-01 was 134.95%.

**Wisconsin Higher Education Grant - WTC**

WHEG - WTC has committed 170.86% (\$24,254,779) of its appropriation with 28,389 awards. This is 1,621 more awards and 0.86% less committed than at this time last year. Please note that "W" codes have been implemented due to a dramatic increase in eligible applicants. In 2000-01 the program had committed 171.72% of its appropriation at this time. The final commitment for 2000-01 was 171.72%.

**Wisconsin Tuition Grant**

WTG has committed 121.95% (\$26,297,560) of its appropriation with 11,825 awards. This is 1,415 less awards and 1.07% more committed than at this time last year. In 2000-01 the program had committed 120.88% of its appropriation at this time. The final commitment for 2000-01 was 120.88%.

**Status of Applicants**

The number of applicants (first-time FAFSA filers including graduate students, non-degree students and possibly non-Wisconsin residents) through June 15, 2002, for 2001-02 was 193,436.

**2002-2003**

**Wisconsin Higher Education Grant - UW**

WHEG - UW has committed 101.20% (\$22,477,188) of its appropriation with 18,464 awards. This is 1,539 more awards and 1.78% more committed than at this time last year. In 2001-02 the program had committed 99.42% of its appropriation at this time. The final commitment for 2001-02 was 134.77%.

**Wisconsin Higher Education Grant - WTC**

WHEG - WTC has committed 122.33% (\$17,550,715) of its appropriation with 20,579 awards. This is 3,368 more awards and 19.61% more committed than at this time last year. In 2001-02 the program had committed 102.72% of its appropriation at this time. The final commitment for 2001-02 was 170.86%.

**Wisconsin Tuition Grant**

WTG has committed 111.47% (\$25,110,177) of its appropriation with 11,247 awards. This is 1,021 more awards and 5.82% more committed than at this time last year. In 2001-02 the program had committed 105.65% of its appropriation at this time. The final commitment for 2001-02 was 121.95%.

**Status of Applicants**

The number of applicants (first-time FAFSA filers including graduate students, non-degree students and possibly non-Wisconsin residents) through July 29, 2002, for 2002-03 is 153,903. Last year at this time there were 141,113 applicants. Applicants for 2001-02 totaled 193,436.
