BOARD REPORT #06-15  
WISCONSIN STATE STUDENT FINANCIAL AID DATA FOR 2004-05**

The series of exhibits in this Board Report present 2004-05 academic year need-based and non-need-based student financial aid information for Wisconsin resident undergraduates. The colleges and universities within the four different Wisconsin Higher Education Sectors provided the majority of the information reflected in these exhibits. Data was collected by HEAB through the annual Wisconsin Student Support Information System (WISSIS) survey, which is authorized by section HEA1.02 of the State Administrative Code. The four sectors of colleges and universities include the Independent Colleges and Universities, the Tribal Colleges, the University of Wisconsin System, and the Wisconsin Technical College System. The first group of exhibits reflects all students from all sectors who receive need-based assistance. The second, third, fourth and fifth groups show need-based financial aid data for each sector of schools. The sixth group incorporates the non-need-based assistance received by students who also receive need-based assistance, and the last group combines need-based and non-need-based financial assistance.

**EXHIBITS A – K (Need-Based Assistance - All Sectors)**

These exhibits show the number of student financial aid recipients, total cost of education, total expected family contribution, total aid received by type and source, and total unmet need. Total number of recipients increased by 4.1% from 2003-04. The total expected family contribution rose by 10.9% from the prior year, and the cost of education increased by 9.8%. Total need-based financial aid increased by 8.8%, following an increase of 10.0% last year. The total number of awards increased by 5.0% in 2004-05. The average award increased by \$80 (3.7%), from \$2,177 in 2003-04 to \$2,257 in 2004-05. Financial need increased by 9.3% from 2003-04 to 2004-05. While need-based financial aid increased 8.8%, total unmet need still increased by 10.0% in 2004-05, as compared to 22.2% in 2003-04. This increase in unmet need was lower than in 2003-04, due to the expected family contribution rising at a faster rate than the cost of education in 2004-05. While the dollars of need-based aid increased, aid did not keep pace with the increase in financial need.

This is the seventh year that the WISSIS data has been collected using a re-definition of need-based and non-need-based aid. Beginning with the 1998-99 report, most Institutional, Private and Other Assistance were reported in the non-need-based informational sections, rather than with the need-based aid. This change was implemented to better reflect the sources of support that finance the total cost of education.

Reliance on loans continues to be a concern; in 2004-05, loans accounted for 45.0% of all need-based aid. This percentage is a small increase over 2003-04, and the second year that loan use has increased, after slightly declining each year for the prior seven years. This increase in the loan assistance percentage is accompanied by a small decrease in the percentage of grant assistance, also for the second year in the past nine years. Overall loan debt continues to rise, and there are sources of student debt (i.e. credit cards) that are not tracked by HEAB or the

institutions. State funded need-based assistance decreased slightly in terms of the portion of need it met (down by 0.09% from 2003-04), while federally funded aid also decreased slightly (72.8% in 2004-05 compared to 72.9% in 2003-04). The primary source of assistance in 2004-05 was, as it has been in the past, federally funded aid.

Exhibit D reflects data for FAFSA applicants, not aid recipients. Exhibit E is a new chart showing the percentage of the cost of education which is not covered by the EFC for each sector. Exhibit G is also a new chart, showing the numbers of Wisconsin-resident students who applied for and received need-based aid for each sector. The order of some of the exhibits in this section has changed from last year.

### **EXHIBITS L - P (Need-Based Assistance - Independent Colleges and Universities)**

For the Independent Colleges and Universities in 2004-05, the number of aid recipients increased by 1.1%, and the number of awards increased by 1.7%. The average award amount increased by 3.4%. The cost of education increased by 5.6%, and the expected family contribution increased by 7.3%. The total amount of need-based aid increased by 5.1%. Unmet need increased by 3.8%. The increase in unmet need is significantly less than last year (24.1% in 2003-04) due to the expected family contribution increasing at a higher rate than the cost of education in 2004-05. The primary type of assistance continues to come in the form of grants. The majority of assistance is funded by the federal government, but to a much lesser extent compared to all other sectors. Institutional assistance accounts for a significantly larger portion of need-based aid than in the other sectors.

Exhibit P reflects data for FAFSA applicants, not aid recipients.

### **EXHIBITS Q - U (Need-Based Assistance - Tribal Colleges)**

For the Tribal Colleges in 2004-05, the number of aid recipients decreased by 4.6%, but the number of awards increased by 3.8%. The average award amount increased by 3.7%. The cost of education decreased by 11.8%, and the expected family contribution increased by 68.4%. The total amount of need-based aid increased by 7.7%. Unmet need decreased by 41.3%. This is due to the decrease in the cost of education in 2004-05 as compared to the previous year. (Cost of education increased 59.0% in 2003-04). The primary type of assistance continues to come in the form of grants. State funded need-based aid makes up 22.5% of all need-based aid available to Tribal Colleges. This is approximately twice as much as in the other sectors.

Exhibit U reflects data for FAFSA applicants, not aid recipients.

### **EXHIBITS V - Z (Need-Based Assistance - University of Wisconsin System)**

For the UW System in 2004-05, the number of aid recipients increased by 5.7%, and the number of awards increased by 6.0%. The average award amount increased by 7.1%. The cost of education increased by 16.0%, and expected family contribution increased by 14.8%. The total amount of need-based aid increased 13.5%. Unmet need increased by 24.4%. This is due to both the increase in the expected family contribution and the increase in need-based assistance

not keeping pace with the increase in the cost of education. Loan use increased again in 2004-05 and grant use decreased, for the second year in a row. The majority of funds in 2004-05 continued to come from loan sources and from programs funded by the federal government.

Exhibit Z reflects data for FAFSA applicants, not aid recipients.

**EXHIBITS AA - EE (Need-Based Assistance - Wisconsin Technical College System)**

For the WTC System in 2004-05, the number of aid recipients increased by 4.0%, and the number of awards increased 5.9%. The average award decreased by 1.9%. The cost of education increased 5.7%, and expected family contribution increased by 8.8%. Total need-based assistance increased by 3.9%, and total unmet need increased 5.3%. The increase in unmet need is due to the increase in need-based assistance not keeping pace with the increase in the cost of education. The primary type of assistance continues to come from grants. The majority of aid awarded was federally funded.

Exhibit EE reflects data for FAFSA applicants, not aid recipients.

**EXHIBITS FF - KK (Non-Need-Based Assistance – All Sectors Combined)**

This section identifies the non-need-based assistance received by the students reported in previous sections of this report. The first page combines all four sectors. The following four pages show a breakdown by sector. As noted earlier, this is the seventh year of redefining need-based and non-need-based aid. The number of awards increased by 11.0%, and the total amount of non-need-based aid awarded increased by 14.8%. The average non-need-based aid award increased by 3.5%. The number of private “alternative” loans awards increased by 35.7% in 2004-05.

Exhibit KK is a new chart showing a 5-year comparison of private “alternative” loan use.

**EXHIBITS LL - MM (Need-Based and Non-Need-Based Assistance Combined – All Sectors)**

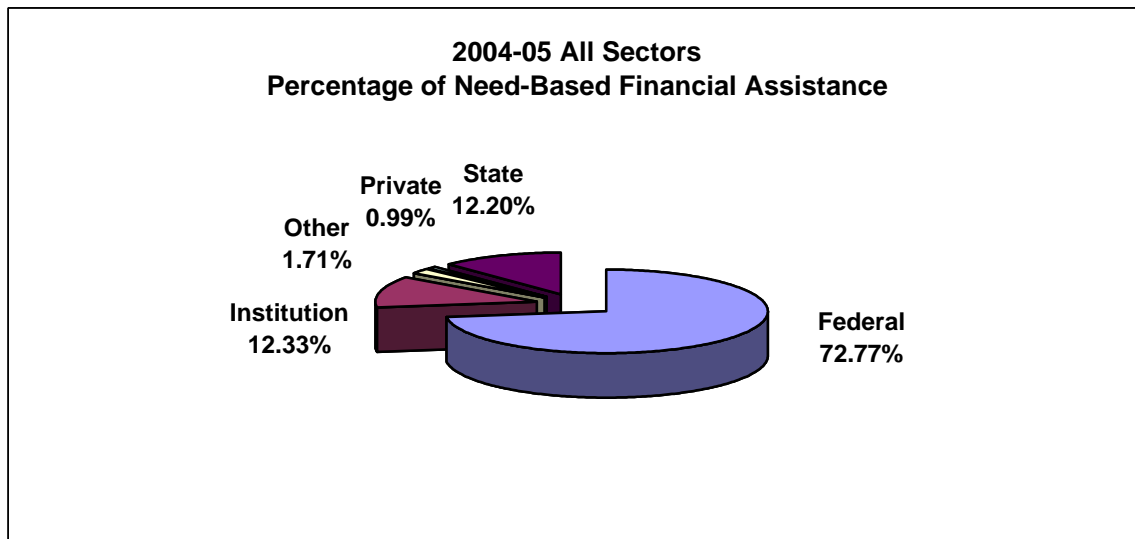
This section combines both the need-based and the non-need-based assistance information. How students finance the total cost of education is provided, as is the source and type of need-based and non-need-based assistance. The largest portion of the cost of education (42.5%) is met by assistance that is based on financial need. The total cost of education met by unknown sources decreased from 9.2% in 2003-04 to 8.5% in 2004-05. The majority of need-based and non-need-based assistance combined is funded by federal loan assistance.

The student population identified in this report includes only Wisconsin-resident, undergraduate students, enrolled at least half-time in a degree or certificate program, who filed a 2004-05 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), and received need-based assistance. Exceptions are Exhibits D, P, U, Z, and EE, which provide data on Wisconsin resident, undergraduate students, awarded and not awarded, for the first school the applicants listed on the FAFSA.

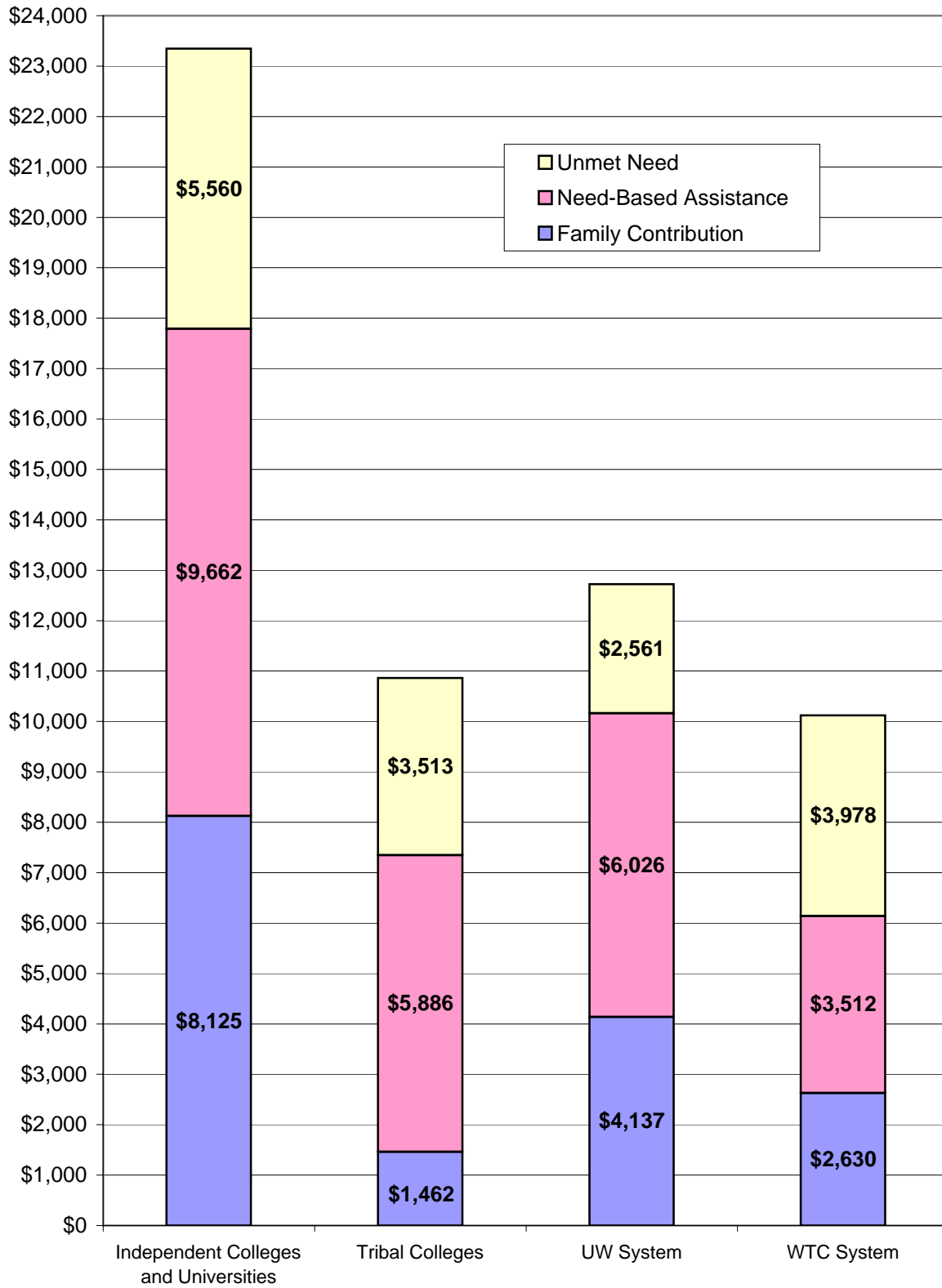

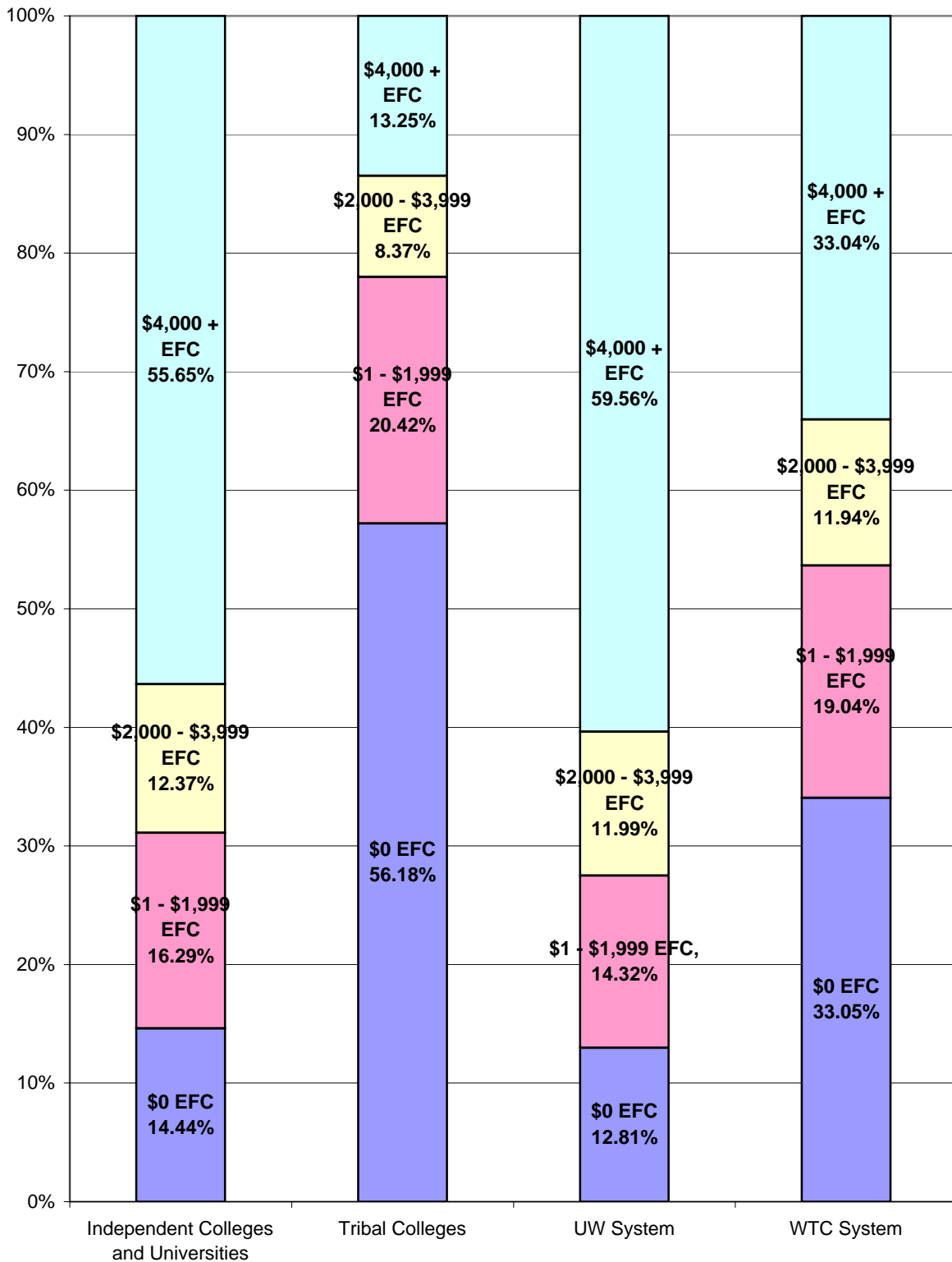

Average Cost of Education / Need-Based Financial Assistance**



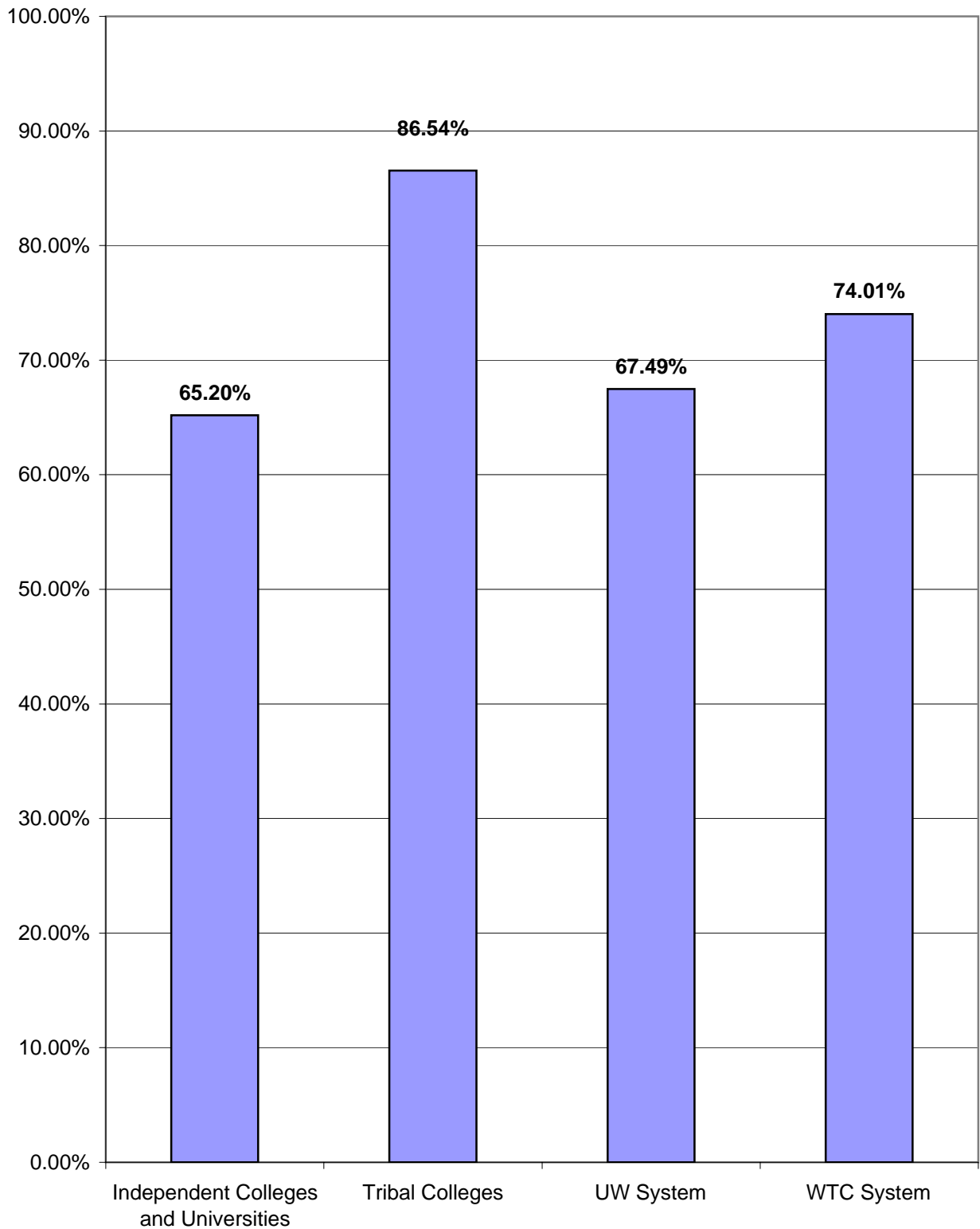

Year-end 2004-05 data above includes Wisconsin resident undergraduates, awarded and unawarded, for the FAFSA filer's first school only.

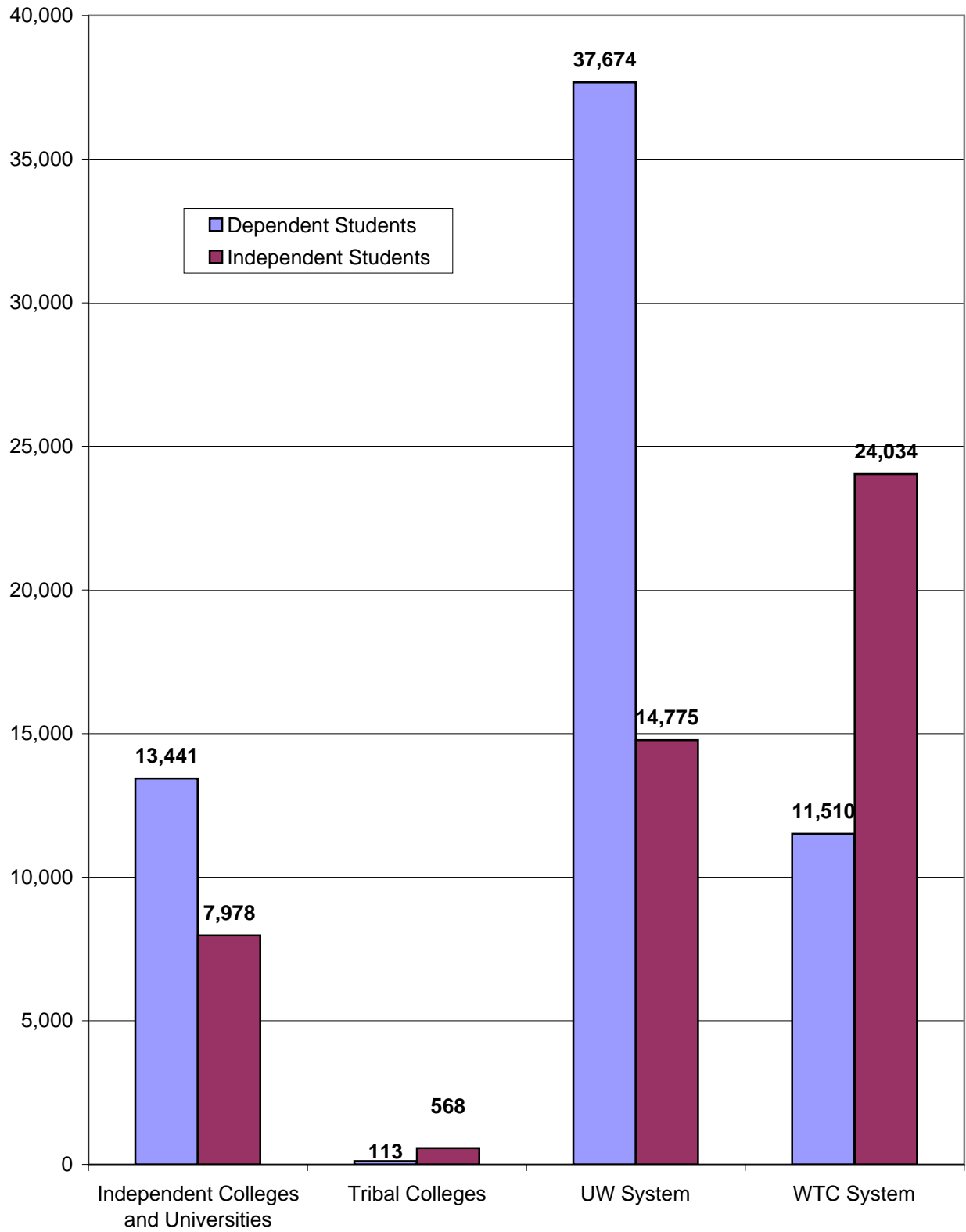

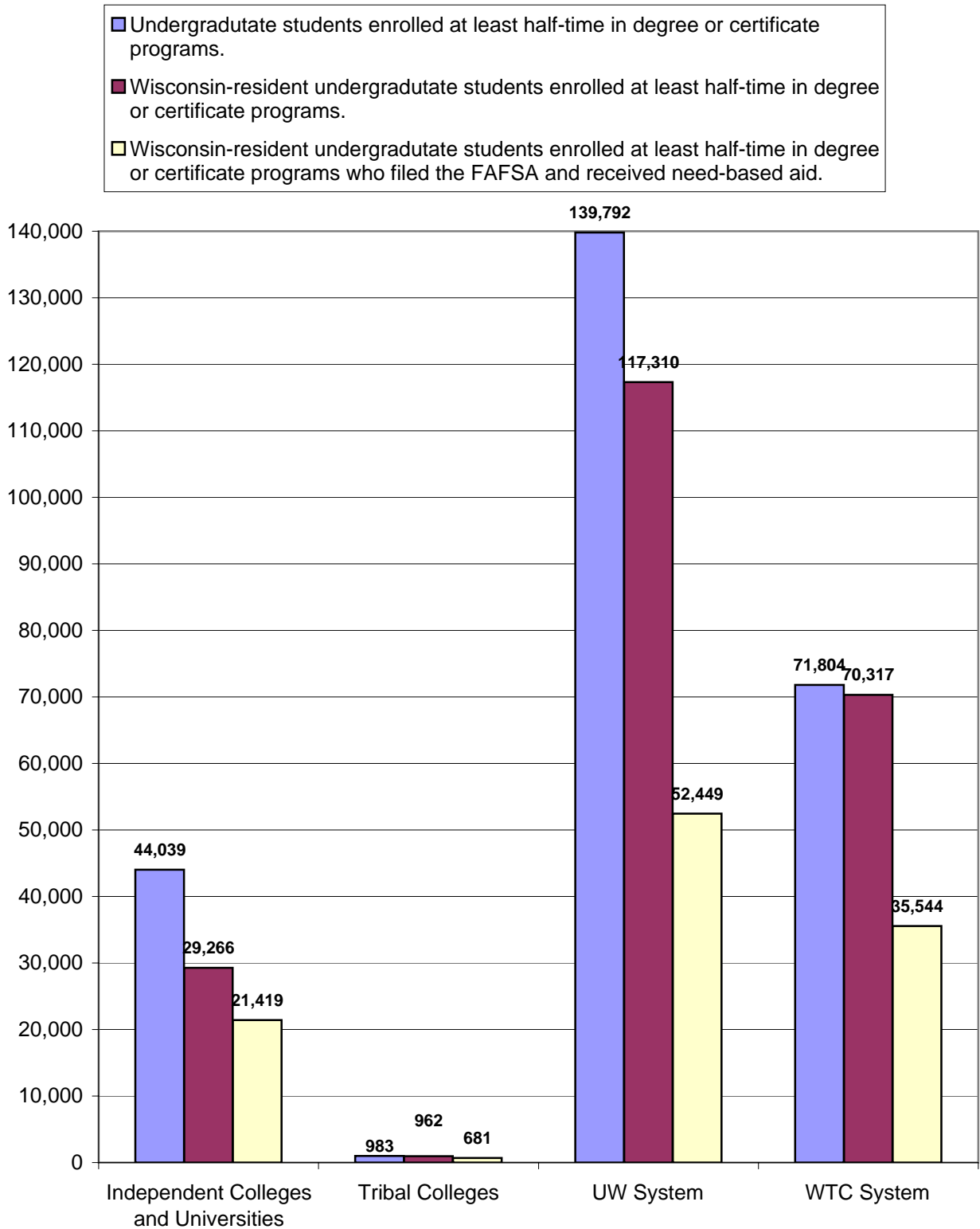


### 2004-05 Dependency Status of Need-Based Aid Recipients



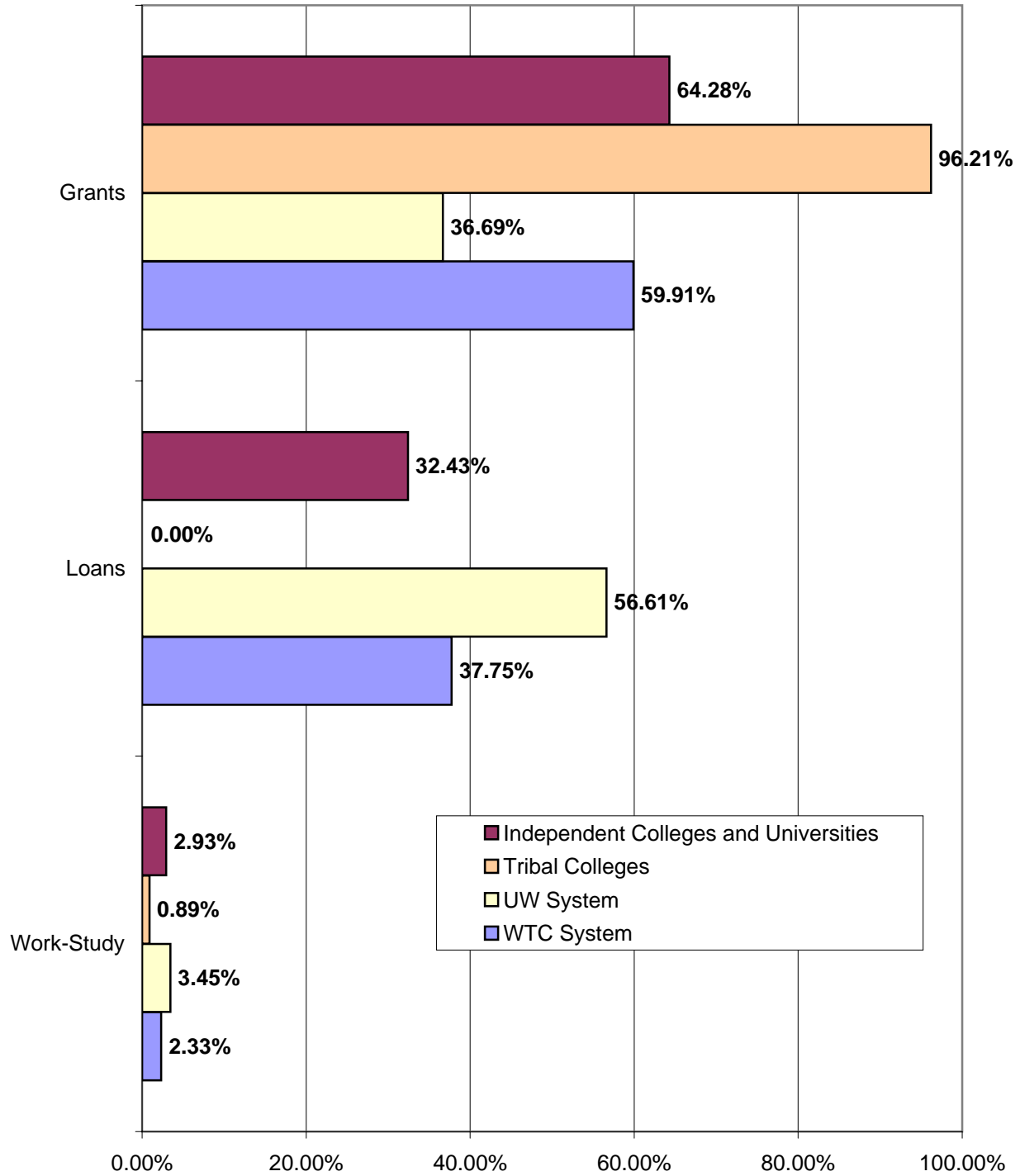

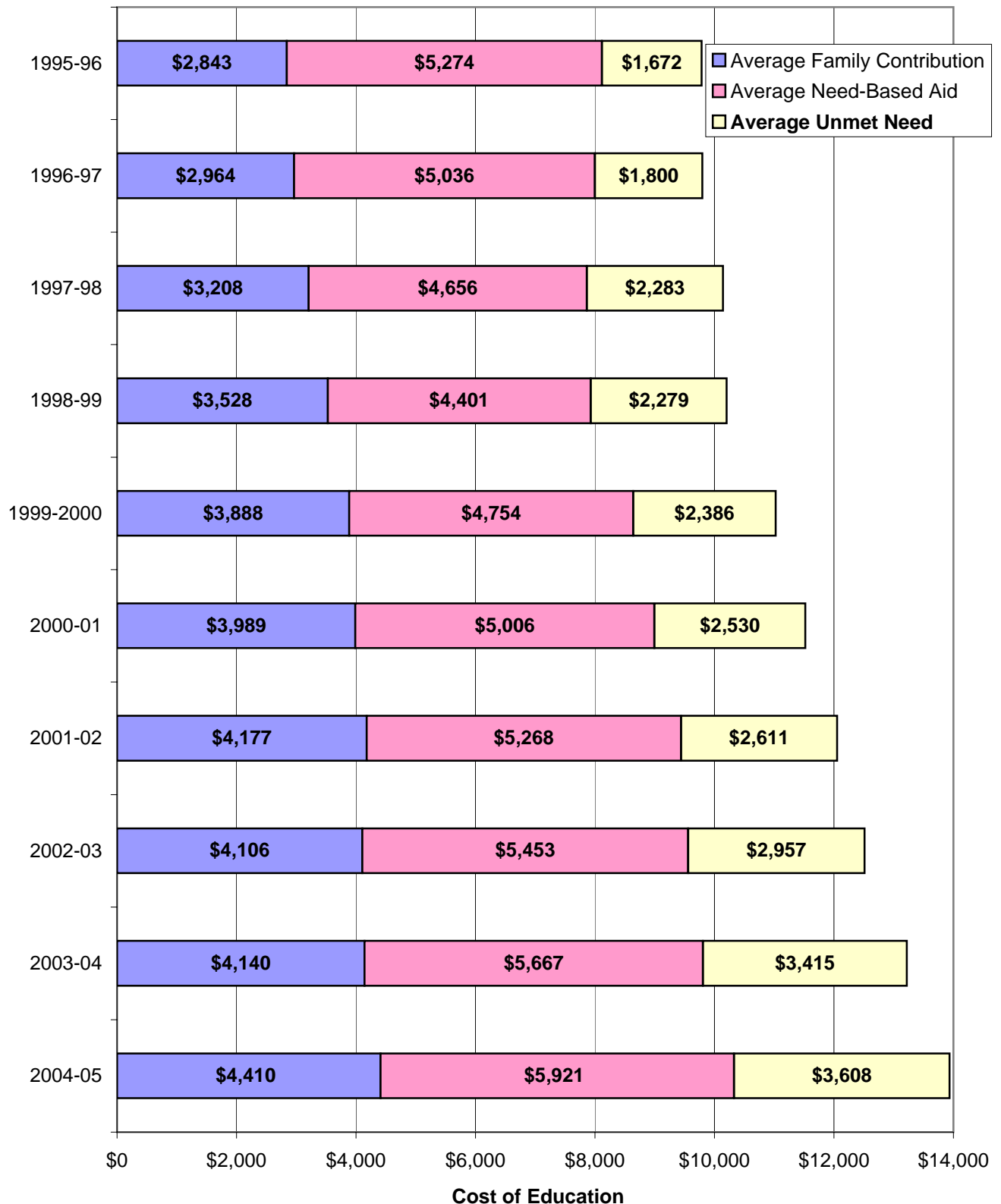

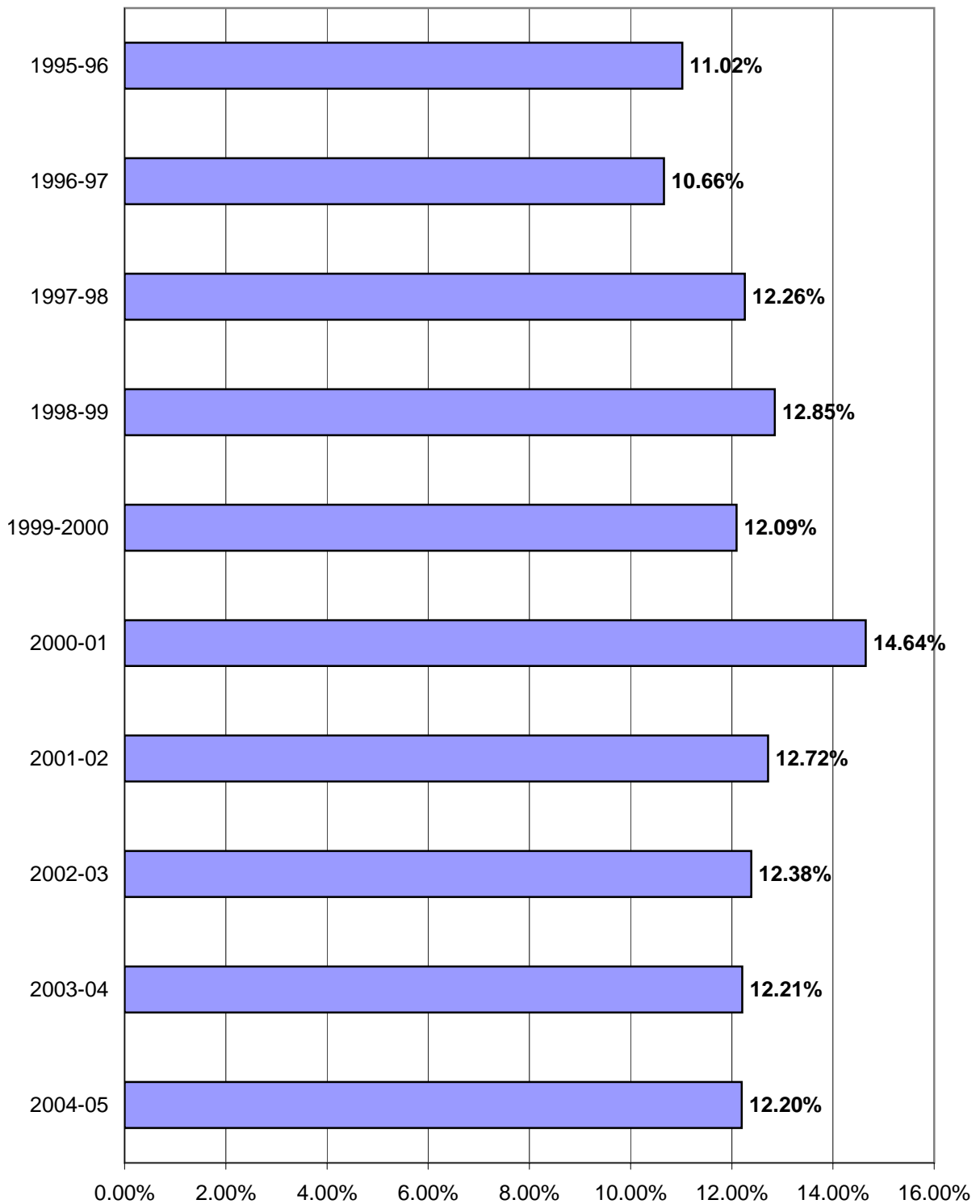

### 10-Year Percentage of Need-Based Financial Assistance Provided by the State of Wisconsin Compared to All Other Sources of Assistance



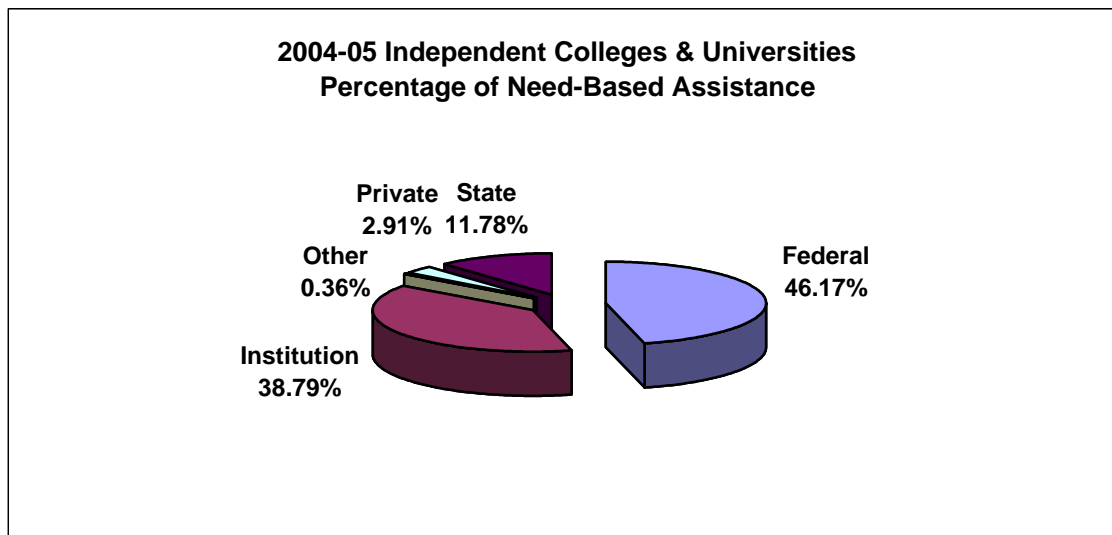

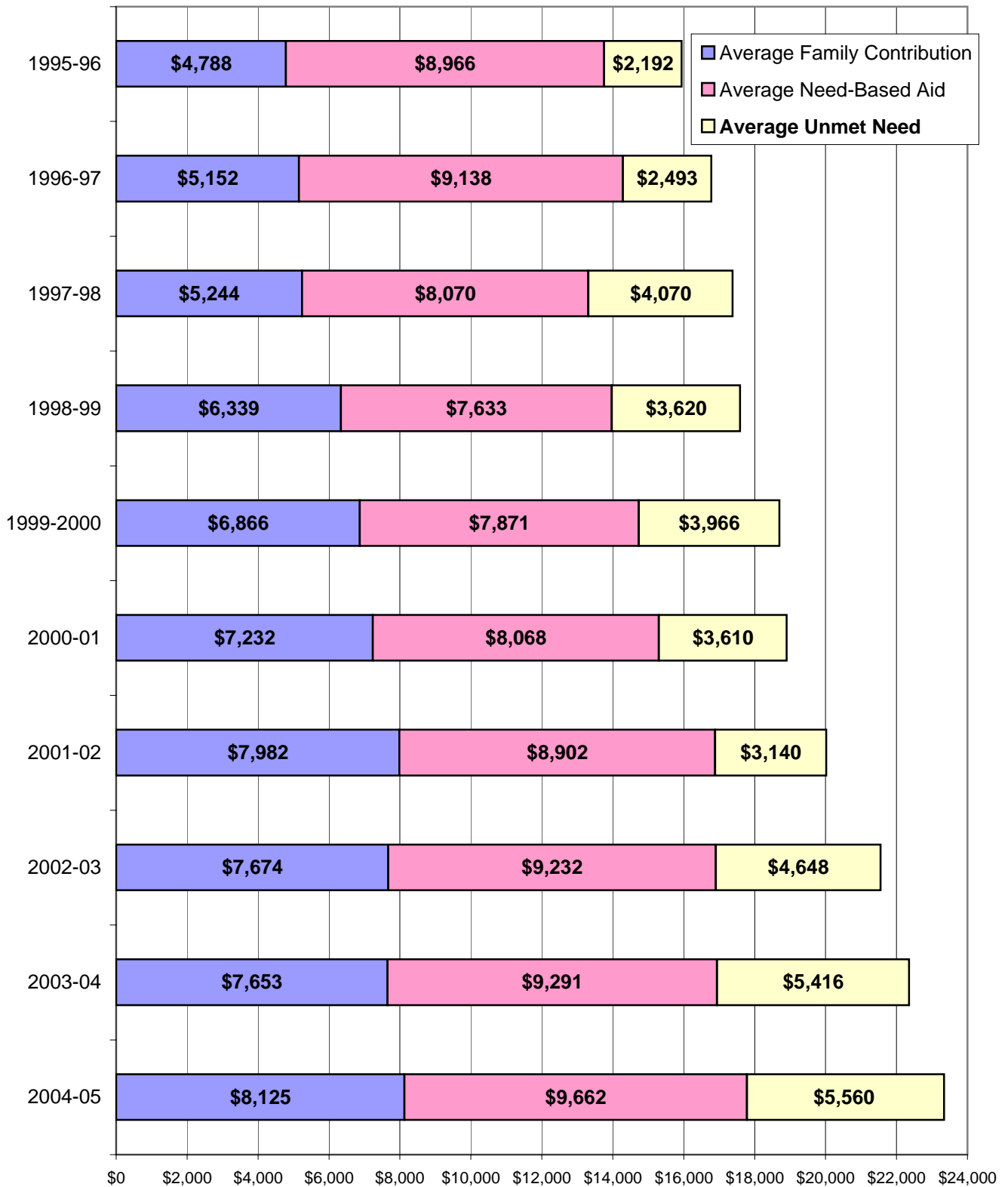

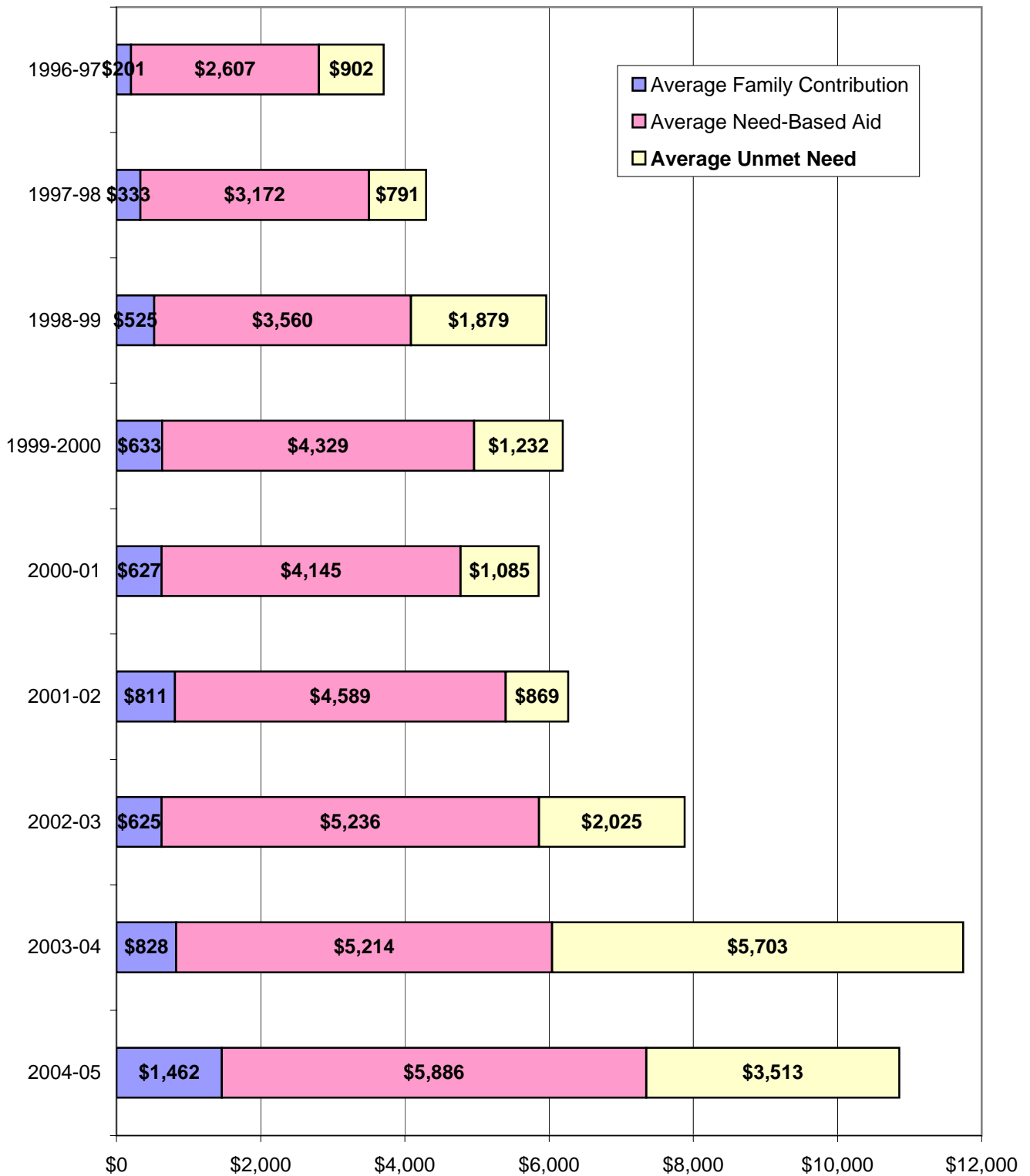

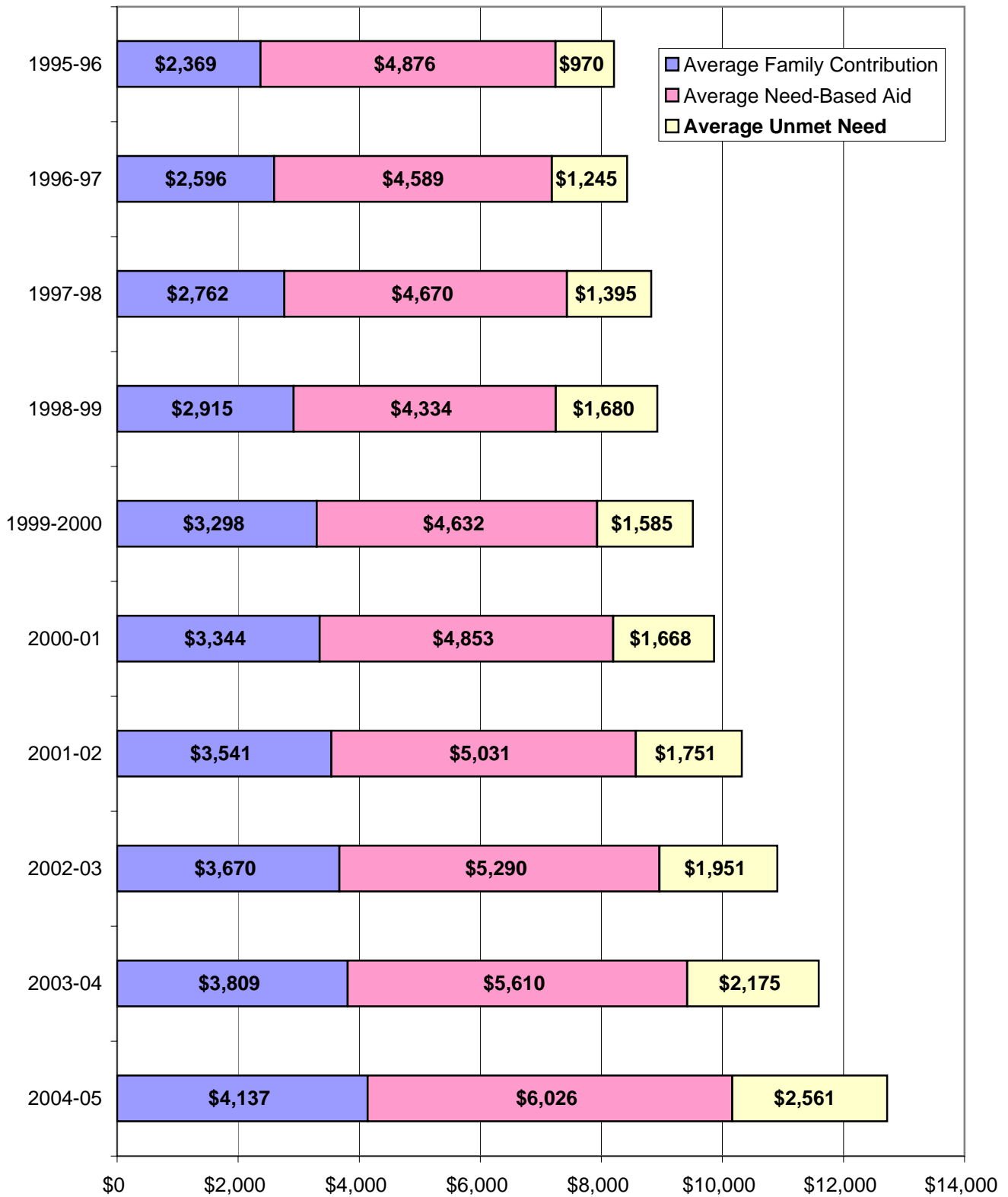

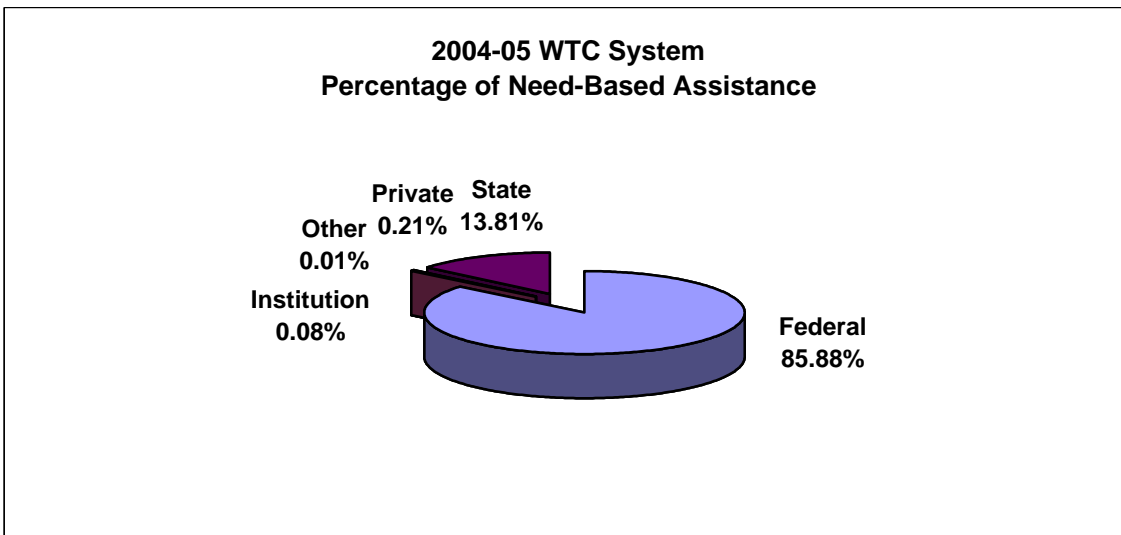

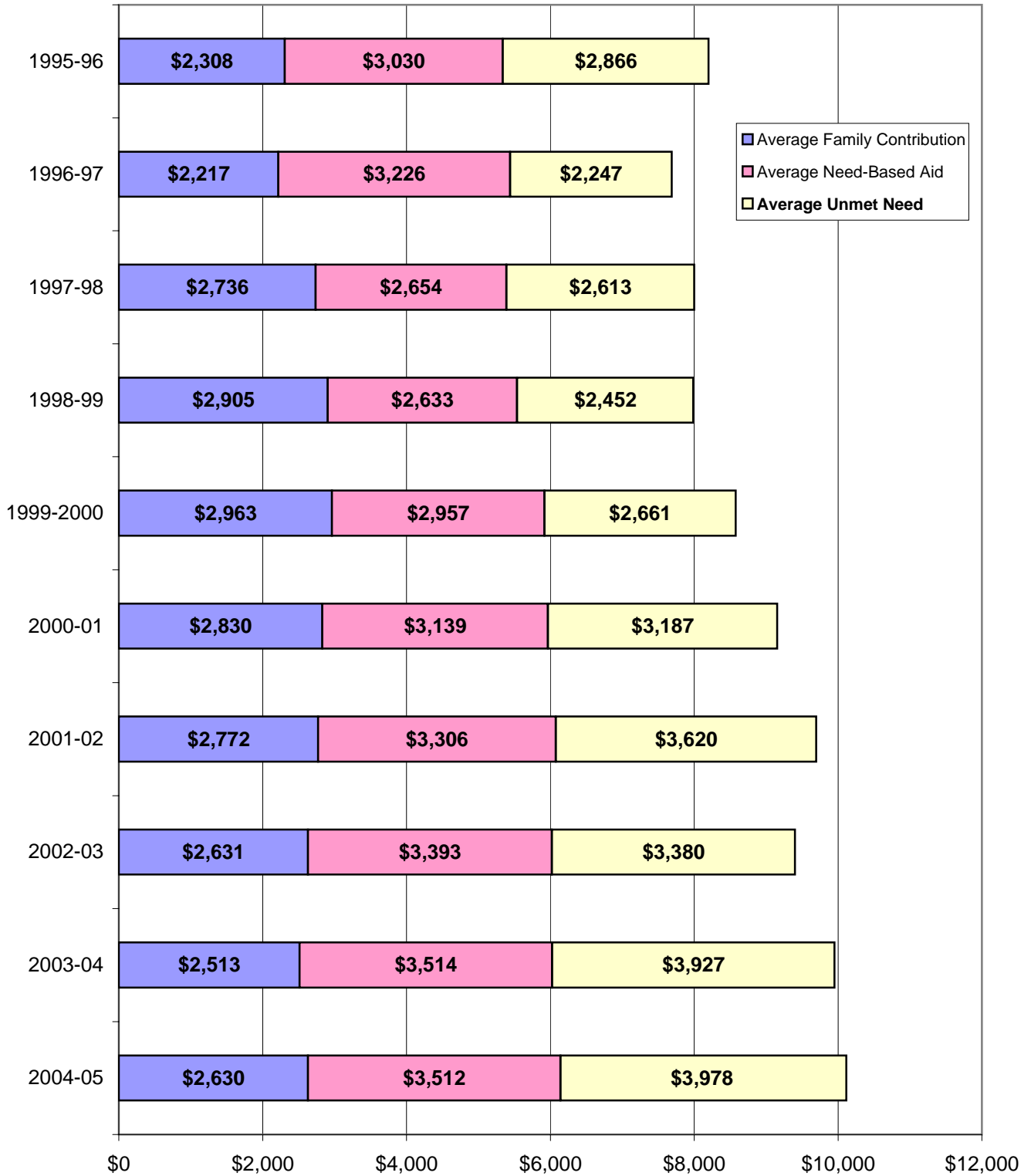
