## 2018-19 MINORITY TEACHER LOAN PROGRAM

### Minority Teacher Loan Program Instructions:

- The Minority Teacher Loan flyer is available on the HEAB website.
- **Please use the nomination roster**, available on the HEAB website, **to nominate loan recipients.**
- Loan recipients may receive a maximum of \$10,000 per academic year and a lifetime maximum of \$30,000. A student may receive a loan in no more than three academic years.
- HEAB must receive the original signed loan agreement and data sheet **BEFORE** funds will be disbursed.
- Distributions not awarded by February 1, 2019, will be re-distributed.
- **All Wisconsin Colleges and Universities with teacher certification programs are encouraged to participate in the Minority Teacher Loan program. Funds are available on a first come, first serve basis.**

### Loan Eligibility Requirements:

To be eligible to receive a Minority Teacher Loan, a student must agree to teach in an elementary or secondary school in the city of Milwaukee and meet all of the following eligibility requirements:

- ✓ Be a member of a minority population: African American, American Indian, Hispanic, or Laotian, Cambodian or Vietnamese who was admitted to the United States after December 31, 1975 (or whose ancestor was) or who is a citizen of Laos, Vietnam or Cambodia.
- ✓ Be a sophomore, junior or senior undergraduate student enrolled at least half-time at a University of Wisconsin System institution or a non-profit, independent college or university in the state of Wisconsin.
- ✓ Have an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher based on a 4.0 scale.
- ✓ Be a Wisconsin resident and registered with the Selective Service (if applicable).
- ✓ Be enrolled in a program of study leading to a teacher's license in a discipline identified as a teacher shortage area for the state of Wisconsin by the United States Department of Education. For the 2018-19 academic year, the following disciplines have been identified as teacher shortage areas in the state of Wisconsin:
