HIGHER EDUCATIONAL AIDS BOARD BOARD REPORT #06-10

PENDING 05-06 LEGISLATIVE BILLS

CURRENTLY PRINTED BILLS THAT COULD BE INTRODUCED IN THE UPCOMING LEGISLATIVE SESSION October 13, 2005

There are currently three bills printed that would directly affect programs administered by the Higher Educational Aids Board. The Board should review each and determine what, if any, position the Board has on these bills.

1. Senate Bill 76

Relating to eligibility for the Academic Excellence Scholarship Changes alternate selection criteria

2. Senate Bill 370

Relating to Academic Excellence Scholars using their scholarship for a 2-year vocation diploma

Allows AES scholars to attend a full-time vocational diploma program

3. Assembly Bill 743

Relating to appropriations for Wisconsin Higher Education Grants and Tuition Grants

Changes how appropriations for WHEG and TG are determined

February 22, 2005 – Introduced by Senators Risser and Erpenbach, cosponsored by Representatives Gronemus, Hahn, Towns and Albers. Referred to Committee on Higher Education and Tourism.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the Higher Educational Aids Board (HEAB) administers the Academic Excellence Higher Education Scholarship Program under which HEAB awards scholarships to certain designated scholars who enroll, on a full-time basis, in a public or private institution of higher education in this state that is participating in the program. Currently, those scholarships may be awarded to the senior with the highest grade point average from each high school in this state enrolling at least 80 but less than 500 pupils, to the two seniors with the two highest grade point averages from each high school in this state enrolling at least 500 but less than 1,000 pupils, to the three seniors with the three highest grade point averages from each high school in this state enrolling at least 1,000 but less than 1,500 pupils, to the four seniors with the four highest grade point averages from each high school in this state enrolling at least 1,500 but less than 2,000 pupils, to the five seniors with the five highest grade point averages from each high school in this state enrolling at least 2,000 but less than 2,500 pupils, and to the six seniors with the six highest grade point averages from each high school in this state enrolling 2,500 or more pupils. In addition, those scholarships may be awarded to the senior with the highest grade point average from the school operated by the Wisconsin Center for the Blind and

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Visually Impaired and the school operated by the Wisconsin Educational Services Program for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing and not more than ten scholarships statewide may be awarded to seniors with the highest grade point averages from high schools enrolling less than 80 pupils.

Currently, if two or more seniors from a high school have the same grade point average and are otherwise eligible for a scholarship, the applicable number of seniors are designated as scholars according to written tie-breaking criteria as required by HEAB by rule and the remaining seniors with the same grade point average are certified as alternates, who may be awarded a scholarship if a designated scholar does not enroll in a participating institution of higher education. In the case of a high school that weights different courses differently to determine a pupil's grade point average, a senior with the next highest grade point average may also be certified as a scholar if the senior who is designated as a scholar does not enroll in a participating institution of higher education and there is no other senior with the same grade point average as the designated scholar.

This bill permits a senior with the next highest grade point average, but not less than 3.800 or the equivalent, to be certified as an alternate and to receive a scholarship if a senior who is designated as a scholar or an alternate with the same grade point average does not enroll in a participating institution of higher education in all cases, regardless of how the high school weights its courses.

If a senior from that high school designated as a scholar under par. (a) does not qualify for a higher education scholarship under sub. (a) shall be eligible for a higher education scholarship as a scholar under sub. (2) (a) or (3) (a) until the scholarship may be awarded by the board. <u>If an alternate with the same grade point</u> average as a scholar under par. Lasee, Darling and Erpenbach, cosponsored by Representatives Lothian, Krawczyk, Gronemus, Fields, Albers, Hines, Musser, Jensen, Ainsworth, Kestell, Pettis, Gunderson, Berceau, Bies, Wood and Davis. Referred to Committee on Higher Education and Tourism.

AN ACT *to amend* 39.41 (2) (b); and *to create* 39.41 (1) (c) of the statutes; relating to: eligibility of a student enrolled in a 2-year, full-time vocational diploma program at a technical college for an academic excellence higher education scholarship.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the Higher Educational Aids Board (HEAB) administers the Academic Excellence Higher Education Scholarship Program under which HEAB awards scholarships to certain scholars, designated on the basis of grade point average, who enroll, on a full–time basis, in a public or private institution of higher education in this state. Under the program, a higher education scholarship recipient who enrolls in an institution within the University of Wisconsin (UW) System or the Technical College System (TCS) is exempt from all tuition and fees, up to \$2,250 per academic year, for each year, up to four years in the UW System and three years in the TCS, that the recipient is enrolled full time, maintains at least a 3.000 grade point average, and makes satisfactory progress toward an associate or a bachelor's degree.

This bill extends eligibility for a higher education scholarship to a scholar enrolled in a two-year, full-time vocational diploma program, which is a program in an area designated and approved by the TCS Board for which the course requirements are established by the TCS Board.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 39.41 (1) (c) of the statutes is created to read:

39.41 **(1)** (c) "Vocational diploma" means a diploma granted to a person who has completed a 2–year, full–time program in an area designated and approved by the technical college system board for which the course requirements are established by that board.

Section 2. 39.41 (2) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:

39.41 (2) (b) For each year that a scholar who receives a scholarship under par. (a) is enrolled full time, maintains at least a 3.000 grade point average, or the equivalent as determined by the institution or district school, and makes satisfactory progress toward an associate or degree, a bachelor's degree, or a vocational diploma, the student shall be exempt from all tuition and fees, including segregated fees, in the subsequent year, except that the maximum scholarship for a scholar who receives an original scholarship for the 1996–97 academic year or for any academic year thereafter may not exceed \$2,250 per academic year. No scholar is eligible for an exemption for more than 4 years in the University of Wisconsin System or more than 3 years at a district school.

SECTION 3. Initial applicability.

(1) ELIGIBILITY FOR ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE HIGHER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS. This act first applies to an academic excellence higher education scholarship originally awarded for the 2005–06 academic year.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the Higher Educational Aids Board (HEAB) provides higher education grants to Wisconsin residents who are enrolled in the University of Wisconsin (UW) System, a technical college, or a tribal college and tuition grants to Wisconsin residents who are enrolled in accredited, nonprofit post–high school, educational institutions in this state. The Board Regents of the UW System provides grants, known as Lawton grants, to minority undergraduates enrolled in the UW System.

Currently, sum certain amounts are appropriated in each fiscal year for tuition grants and for higher education grants for technical college and tribal college students. For higher education grants for UW System students, beginning in fiscal year 2005–06, there is appropriated a sum sufficient equal to the amount appropriated for those grants in the previous fiscal year (base amount) increased by the highest percentage increase in undergraduate academic fees among the institutions within the UW System between the current and previous academic years, except that, if the undergraduate academic fees at each institution within the UW System for the current academic year did not increase from the previous academic year, the appropriation for the current fiscal year remains the base amount. The same formula is also used to calculate the amount appropriated for Lawton grants.

This bill changes the formula used to calculate the amounts appropriated for higher education grants for UW System students and for Lawton grants. The bill also requires HEAB to use the new formula to calculate the amounts appropriated for tuition grants and for higher education grants for technical college and tribal college students. Specifically, under the bill, beginning in fiscal year 2006-07, the amounts appropriated for tuition grants, for Lawton grants, and for higher education grants for UW System students, technical college students, and tribal college students are determined by increasing the base amount for each of those appropriations by the greater of the highest percentage increase determined under current law or the amount obtained by multiplying the increase in the undergraduate academic fees charged for a student to attend the UW-Madison for the current academic year over the previous academic year by the number of students who received the respective grants for the previous academic year, except that, if the undergraduate academic fees at each institution within the UW System did not increase from the previous academic year, the appropriations for the current fiscal year remain the base amounts.

The appropriation for the next fiscal year shall be the result obtained by increasing, to the nearest \$100, the base amount by the highest percentage increase determined under subd. 1. or the amount determined under subd. 1m., whichever is greater, except that, if the undergraduate academic fees for the current academic year decreased or did not change from the undergraduate academic fees charged for the previous academic year at each institution specified in subd. 1., the appropriation shall be the base amount.

Section 22. 39.435 (7) (c) of the statutes is created to read:

39.435 **(7)** (c) Annually, by February 1, the board shall calculate the amount to be appropriated under s. 20.235 (1) (ff) for the next fiscal year as follows:

- 1. The board shall determine the percentage by which the undergraduate academic fees charged for the current academic year at each institution within the University of Wisconsin System has increased or decreased from the undergraduate academic fees charged for the previous academic year.
- 2. The board shall determine the amount by which the undergraduate academic fees charged for a student to attend the University of Wisconsin–Madison for the current academic year has increased or decreased from the amount of undergraduate academic fees charged for a student to attend that institution for the previous academic year and multiply the amount of that increase by the number of

students who received grants from the appropriation account under s. 20.235 (1) (ff) for the previous academic year.

- 3. The appropriation for the next fiscal year shall be the result obtained by increasing, to the nearest \$100, the base amount by the highest percentage increase determined under subd. 1. or the amount determined under subd. 2., whichever is greater, except that, if the undergraduate academic fees for the current academic year decreased or did not change from the undergraduate academic fees charged for the previous academic year at each institution specified under subd. 1., the appropriation shall be the base amount.
 - **SECTION 23.** 39.435 (7) (d) of the statutes is created to read:
- 39.435 **(7)** (d) Annually, by February 1, the board shall calculate the amount to be appropriated under s. 20.235 (1) (km) for the next fiscal year as follows:
- 1. The board shall determine the percentage by which the undergraduate academic fees charged for the current academic year at each institution within the University of Wisconsin System has increased or decreased from the undergraduate academic fees charged for the previous academic year.
- 2. The board shall determine the amount by which the undergraduate academic fees charged for a student to attend the University of Wisconsin–Madison for the current academic year has increased or decreased from the amount of undergraduate academic fees charged for a student to attend that institution for the previous academic year and multiply the amount of that increase by the number of students who received grants from the appropriation account under s. 20.235 (1) (km) for the previous academic year.
- 3. The appropriation for the next fiscal year shall be the result obtained by increasing, to the nearest \$100, the base amount by the highest percentage increase

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determined under subd. 1. or the amount determined under subd. 2., whichever is
greater, except that, if the amount of the undergraduate academic fees for the current
academic year decreased or did not change from the undergraduate academic fees
charged for the previous academic year at each institution specified in subd. 1., the
appropriation shall be the base amount.
SECTION 24. Effective dates. This act takes effect on the day after publication,
except as follows:
(1) Tuition, higher education, and Lawton grants. The treatment of sections
